1. The use of pens, portable copiers and scanners is prohibited. Pencils must be used for writing. Laptop computers and digital cameras without flash may be used.
2. Materials must be viewed flat, with care, in their folders on the table and maintained in their original order. No marks, erasures, or tracings may be made on any material.
3. The Library reserves the right to inspect articles brought into the area. Outerwear, briefcases, and any bag larger than this sheet of paper must be stored in the designated lockers. Only pencil and paper may be brought to the table.
4. There is no smoking, eating, drinking, or gum chewing allowed in any part of the Library.
5. Separate application for permission to quote or to publish materials must be made to the Director of Library Services. In the interest of ongoing research, we request that a copy of the publication in which the quotations or images will appear be sent for deposit in the Library.

I understand that I am responsible for conforming to copyright and other applicable statutes. I understand that the American Museum of Natural History is not necessarily the owner of copyrights of unpublished manuscripts in its collections and that permission to publish must be obtained from the owners, the Museum, or otherwise. I agree to abide by all of the above regulations, which I have read, and by any additional restrictions imposed by the donors of certain collections.
